# About the current situation 16

## Future Pattern of Public Worship



As advised previously, the Government has announced that public worship in church can resume from Sunday 5<sup>th</sup> July. It is my intention to hold a Sung Eucharist at 11am on that day, as might normally be held, and I hope very much that as many of you as possible will want to be present and receive the Sacrament. Services thereafter will resume their usual pattern.

The provision of virtual services by Zoom will finish after today – with the possible exception of Compline by Zoom continuing on its current fortnightly pattern if there is a sufficient demand for it. However, although public worship will resume, it will not be a return to normality yet – and perhaps not for quite a while.

The following restrictions will apply:

- Entry to the church will take place through the West Door in the Tower, as usual, and then follow a circular movement around church to the pews (omitting the centre aisle), leaving by the South Door and garden into Botolph Lane.
- Singing is explicitly prohibited (because the voice and any associated droplets are thrown over a much larger area), but organ music is explicitly permitted. The prohibition of singing is a particular issue for us because it forms such a central part of our worship. We are looking at various possible options to mitigate the impact of this prohibition, while conforming to the letter and spirit of the guidelines.

- Prayer Books and Hymn books will be issued, but cannot be recirculated. Please take a set home with you and then bring the set back to subsequent services; otherwise leave the books in the pews, please, for sanitisation.
- A collection cannot physically be taken. The Good Box will be repositioned to be near the West Door on leaving, so a donation by card can be made then. Alternatively, please contact David Eastwood to arrange a standing order or other ways of contributing.
- The Sacrament will be administered in one kind only the host. The Church holds that Christ is wholly present in each of the elements of bread and wine. It will be administered by the priest standing at the Chancel step, with the congregation receiving while standing too. Directions will be given for a circular movement around church to this Communion station, respecting social distancing.
- The priest will wear PPE, to include some or all of face shield, surgical mask and gloves. Although I should imagine that this will appear quite unsightly and uncomfortable for the wearer it is to give confidence that the maximum possible protection is being used and encourage participation.
- The Choir stalls will be closed. Therefore, sitting for the 8.00am and Wednesday 10.30am Holy Communion services, when the congregation normally sits in the Choir Stalls, will need to take place, socially distanced, in the Nave pews instead.
