THE FIRST LESSON (read by Sarah Boyer)

The first lesson is written in the fiftieth chapter of the Book of the Prophet Isaiah, beginning at the fourth verse

The Lord God hath given me the tongue of the learned, that I should know how to speak a word in season to him that is weary: he wakeneth morning by morning, he wakeneth mine ear to hear as the learned. The Lord God hath opened mine ear, and I was not rebellious, neither turned away back. I gave my back to the smiters, and my cheeks to them that plucked off the hair: I hid not my face from shame and spitting. For the Lord God will help me; therefore shall I not be confounded: therefore have I set my face like a flint, and I know that I shall not be ashamed. He is near that justifieth me; who will contend with me? let us stand together: who is mine adversary? Let him come near to me. Behold, the Lord God will help me; who is he that shall condemn me? lo, they all shall wax old as a garment; the moth shall eat them up. Who is among you that feareth the Lord, that obeyeth the voice of his servant, that walketh in darkness, and hath no light? Let him trust in the name of the Lord, and stay upon his God.

Here endeth the first lesson.



- HEAR my prayer O Lord, and consider 'my de'sire : hearken unto me for thy 'truth and 'righteousness' sake.
- 2 And enter not into judgement 'with thy 'servant : for in thy sight shall 'no man' living be 'justified.
- 3 For the enemy hath persecuted my soul, he hath smitten my life 'down to the'ground : he hath laid me in the darkness, as the 'men that have'been long'dead.
- 4 Therefore is my spirit'vexed with'in me : and my 'heart with-'in me is 'desolate.
- 5 Yet do I remember the time past, I muse upon 'all thy 'works : yea, I exercise myself in the 'works of 'thy 'hands.
- 6 I stretch forth my hands' unto' thee : my soul gaspeth unto thee 'as a' thirsty' land.
- 7 Hear me O Lord and that soon, for my spirit 'waxeth ' faint : hide not thy face from me, lest I be like unto them that go ' down 'into the 'pit.
- 8 O let me hear thy loving-kindness betimes in the morning, for in thee 'is my'trust : shew thou me the way that I should walk in, for I lift up my'soul'unto'thee.
- 9 Deliver me O Lord' from mine' enemies : for I flee' unto' thee to 'hide me.
- 10 Teach me to do the thing that pleaseth thee, for thou' art my' God : let thy loving Spirit lead me forth' into the 'land of ' righteousness.
- 11 Quicken me O Lord for thy 'Name's 'sake : and for thy righteousness' sake bring my 'soul 'out of 'trouble.
- 12 And of thy goodness' slay mine' enemies : and destroy all them that vex my soul, for'I am'thy' servant.

THE SECOND LESSON (read by Miranda Zwalf)

The second lesson is written in the thirteenth chapter of the Gospel according to St Luke, beginning at the twenty second verse.

And Jesus went through the cities and villages, teaching, and journeying toward Jerusalem. Then said one unto him, Lord, are there few that be saved? And he said unto them, Strive to enter in at the strait gate: for many, I say unto you, will seek to enter in, and shall not be able. When once the master of the house is risen up, and hath shut to the door, and ye begin to stand without, and to knock at the door, saying, Lord, Lord, open unto us; and he shall answer and say unto you, I know you not whence ye are: Then shall ye begin to say, We have eaten and drunk in thy presence, and thou hast taught in our streets. But he shall say, I tell you, I know you not whence ye are; depart from me, all ye workers of iniquity. There shall be weeping and gnashing of teeth, when ye shall see Abraham, and Isaac, and Jacob, and all the prophets, in the kingdom of God, and you yourselves thrust out. And they shall come from the east, and from the west, and from the north, and from the south, and shall sit down in the kingdom of God. And, behold, there are last which shall be first, and there are first which shall be last.

Here endeth the second lesson.

Thou sittest at the right hand of God: in the glory of the Father. We believe that thou shalt come : to be our Judge. We therefore pray thee, help thy servants : whom thou hast redeemed with thy precious blood. Make them to be numbered with thy Saints : in glory everlasting. O Lord, save thy people : and bless thine heritage. Govern them : and lift them up for ever. Day by day : we magnify thee; And we worship thy Name : ever world without end. Vouchsafe, O Lord : to keep us this day without sin. O Lord, have mercy upon us : have mercy upon us. O Lord, let thy mercy lighten upon us : as our trust is in thee. O Lord, in thee have I trusted : let me never be confounded.

Likewise, after supper, he took the Cup; and, when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, saying: *Drink ye all of this; for this is my Blood of the New Testament, which is shed for you, and for many, for the remission of sins; Do this, as oft as ye shall drink it, in remembrance of me*. **Amen.**
