THE COMMUNION

¶ *In accordance with the Anglican tradition, Holy Communion is administered in both kinds i.e. the consecrated Bread and Wine. During the current pandemic, this can only be offered by intinction i.e. the consecrated wafer dipped in the consecrated wine, as the sharing of the Common Cup (Chalice) by sipping the consecrated wine is not permitted.*

COVER IMAGE

According to Matthew's account of the Gospel, Jesus gave this sermon on a mountain in Galilee. The sermon was intended primarily for the disciples but Jesus also spoke to the crowd. ¹ The Sermon on the Mount, the longest and most prominent of the Five Discourses of Matthew's Gospel emphasized his moral teaching delivered early in His ministry after His baptism. Five divisions in this gospel concern discipleship (Matt. 5-7); apostleship (Matt. 9:36-10:42); the hiding of the revelation (Matt. 13:1- 53); church administration (Matt. 17:22-18:35), and the judgment (Matt. 23-25). ²

In this sermon, Jesus taught his followers the Lord's Prayer and told them several parables. The sermon contained the Beatitudes and His teachings about God's laws, which He expected His followers to uphold. It is considered by contemporary scholars to be the epitome of Jesus' teaching and thus the essence of Christianity. However, interpretations have varied over the centuries from the Patristic era and the *Didache*, St Chrysostom and St Augustine, the medieval period notably St Thomas Aquinas, the Reformations of Luther, Anabaptists and Calvin to the present day. It is important to recognise the original Jewish context to discern the meaning of the Sermon on the Mount. ³
